



Born as Ishwarchandra Bandyopadhyay 1820. earned the he "vidvasagar" the "ocean of knowledge" after he translated a number of the William Shakespeare's dramas into Bengali. He also translated a number of Sanskrit classics. By simplifying Bengali typography, he made the language more accessible to the common people. Growing up, he became a powerful voice against oppression faced by women in 19th century Bengal.




